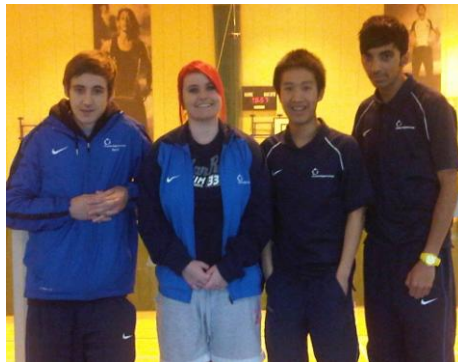
BRITISH COLLEGES SPORTS TOURNAMENTS
